

# Asia Integrated Reporting Awards 2023

# **ENTRY BRIEFING**

The Asia Integrated Reporting Awards (AIRA) recognise and honourIntegrated reporting leaders in Asia. The Awards celebrate best practice in integrated reporting and communications.AIRA is a once-in-a-year opportunity for all types of organisations to build trust and awareness amongst their stakeholders by showcasing their integrated initiatives.

The 2023 Awards are being offered in 8 categories. In addition, judges will choose the Integrated Report of the Year as a special award.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

AIRA is open to all organisations which publish an integrated report.

The types of reports eligible for the awards include:

- Integrated Report
- Annual Report

Entries will be accepted for the most recent report published by an organisation.

## **ENTRIES**

Entries must be submitted by filling in the Entry Form. A separate entry form is required for each report being submitted. The Entry Form is available for download from the Awards webpage at <a href="https://csrworks.com/aira/entry-form/">https://csrworks.com/aira/entry-form/</a>

## CATEGORIES

An organisation may submit entries for multiple categories\*.

The following categories are open for entry:

- 1. Asia's Best Integrated Report (Large Company)
- 2. Asia's Best Integrated Report (SME)
- 3. Asia's Best Integrated Report (Public Sector)
- 4. Asia's Best Integrated Report (First Time)
- 5. Asia's Best Integrated Report (CEO Message)
- 6. Asia's Best Integrated Report (Governance)
- 7. Asia's Best Integrated Report (Integrated Thinking)
- 8. Asia's Best Integrated Report (Value Creation)

\*\*Asia's Integrated Report of the Year is a special honour and will be presented as the Judges' Choice. Separate entry for this category is not required.

### JUDGING

We are committed to following the highest standards in awards judging. The guiding principles for judging the Awards include independent from organisers, integrity, objectivity, impartiality, avoidance of conflict of interest, and transparency.

#### Independent Judging Panel

An independent panel of judges with distinguished backgrounds assesses the entries to decide the winners. The judging board has members drawn from diverse fields such as non-profit organisations, academia, sustainability advocacy, professional bodies, industry networks, and media to enrich the judging process. The judging panel is entirely independent of the organisers to maintain the highest possible neutrality and objectivity.

The panel of judges evaluates all submissions following rigorous criteria. Information about the judges is available on the website.

### > Judging Process

Entries will be evaluated in three rounds:

**First Round:** In this round, an initial evaluation will be carried out by experienced ESG Analysts. The qualifying entries will then proceed to the judging round (second round).

**Second Round:** Judges will determine the finalists for each category. Each category is expected to have 8-12 finalists. The names of the finalists will be announced around mid-December.

**Third & Final Round:** In the third round, also the final round, the judges will take a closer look at the entries and will decide the winners.

#### > Winners

Each category is likely to have three awards – Gold, Silver and Bronze. The winners will be announced in Feb/Mar 2024 at an Awards Ceremony in Singapore.

#### > What will be judged?

Only the publicly available integrated report will be considered for judging the entry. Integrated information which is not disclosed publicly, and future plans and initiatives, will not be accepted as a basis for judging.

#### > Judging Criteria

Judges will be using a broad set of parameters to evaluate each entry. Some of the parameters may apply to specific award categories, while others may be more commonly applied. We recognise that integrated reporting is a journey and different organisations may be at a different point in their journey. That is why it is not mandatory to meet the entire criteria to be a winner. However, the winners would have demonstrated that they are ahead of their peers when tested against these overall parameters.

In general, judges will be using the following parameters:

- 1. How strong is the link between the company's reported integrated strategies and activities and its business strategy?
- Whether the company uses internationally accepted integrated reporting frameworks such as GRI and Integrated Reporting. Also, how well the organisation uses other integrated frameworks such as the SDGs, TCFD, CDP or other sector-specific guidelines.
- 3. How the company identifies, describes and addresses its most significant or material impacts and issues.
- 4. How the company engages with stakeholders to build a more credible integrated approach.
- 5. Whether the report provides a clear description of goals and targets and how the progress is measured.
- 6. Whether the report explains how value is created for the company or its stakeholders or both.
- 7. What is the degree of useful disclosure the company provides through the report?
- 8. How comfortable the company is in disclosing its failures, shortcomings, underperformance or sharing the negative news.
- 9. Whether there is an independent assessment of the company's reported performance.Examples of independent assessment may include but are not limited to:
  - a) Views of internal or external stakeholders' incorporated in the integrated report in the relevant sections.
  - b) Views expressed by an important external stakeholder or an external stakeholder panel included in the report.
  - c) Relevant certifications disclosed in the integrated report.
  - d) External Assurance provided by independent assurance providers.

#### JUDGING FEEDBACK

A structured feedback on entries can be useful for organisations who are keen to improve their next report. Participating organisations can choose from the following options:

**Judging Comments:**A brief summary(one or two paragraphs) of Judges' comments may be provided upon request. This service is free of cost and is available to only those participants who have submitted under the "unlimited entries" option. Fee: Free of Cost.

**Assessment Report:** A detailed assessment of the report may be provided for a fee. The assessment report would include recommendations for improvement. Any participating organisation can avail this service. Fee: US\$ 7,500.00

**Virtual Feedback Session:** A 90-minute virtual session in a live webinar format where a member of the judging panel and a reporting expert from CSRWorks will provide specific feedback on the entry and answer questions. Any participating organisation can avail this service. Fee: US\$ 1,200.00

These services are completely optional and voluntary. Interested organisations should contact us for these services after the awards have been announced. Please write to <u>asra@csrworks.com</u> for more information.

### ENTRY FEE

The awards are organised on a non-profit basis. The entry fee is meant to cover the administrative costs and the cost of the awards ceremony and gala dinner event. The entry fee is inclusive of one free pass per organisation for the awards ceremony and gala dinner event.

#### Important Notes

a) A separate Entry Form is required for each report if you are submitting multiple reports for the Awards.

b) Please refer to Asia Sustainability Reporting Awards for entry fee if you are also planning to submit entries for ASRA sub-categories.

c) The entry fee is inclusive of ONE complimentary pass per organisation to attend the awards ceremony & gala dinner event.

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

Submissions will only be evaluated upon receipt of entry fee. Payment can be made by bank transfer or online by credit card. Overseas cheques are not accepted. Singapore based organisations may make payment by cheque.

#### **FINALISTS AND WINNERS**

All winners will receive an award, including a personalised plaque with the winner's name inscribed on it. All finalists will receive a merit certificate.

#### AWARDS BRANDING LOGO

Each finalist and winner will also receive a distinct Awards logo that they can use on their website and other promotional material and reports as a mark of their integrated reporting excellence.

#### AWARDS CEREMONY

All participating companies are invited to the Award Ceremony to be held in Singapore. Each participating organisation will receive one complimentary event pass to attend the Awards Ceremony. Subject to availability, additional passes to the Awards Ceremony may be purchased by interested organisations or individuals. The results of the Awards, i.e. the winners will be announced at the Award Ceremony.

More information about the Awards Ceremony including the exact date, venue and agenda will be announced in due course.
